Greenstone Gold Mines is hosting community open house events to share information about the Hardrock Project, a proposed open pit gold mine. The Hardrock Gold Deposit is located approximately 275 kilometers northeast of Thunder Bay, Ontario. It is situated in the Ward of Geraldton, which is part of the amalgamated Municipality of Greenstone. The property is located on a site that was actively mined in the 1930-1970s.

Greenstone Gold Mines submitted a Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Environmental Assessment (EIS/EA) report February 1, 2016 for review and comment. We would like to meet with residents and stakeholders in the area to discuss updates to the Project since the Draft EIS/EA and share what we have heard. This will be a combination of a formal presentation and a drop-in style meeting with English display materials. Paper copies of French and Ojibwe materials will be available and French-speaking staff will be available to answer questions.

Input received at the meetings will be considered as we finalize the EIS/EA report.
