Dear Friend:

I am writing to share information about the work of Indspire in supporting Indigenous students over the past year while clarifying our role in advancing First Nations, Inuit and Métis student success. The support provided by Indspire to your students is detailed in the enclosed appendix.

Indspire is a national Indigenous charity that invests in the education of Indigenous learners for the long-term benefit of our people, their families, communities and Canada. We serve First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students in communities across Canada, including rural and remote, fly-in and urban centres.

Indspire's work is in addition to the support you provide for your students. We do not administer the Post-Secondary Student Support Program, or the University and College Entrance Preparation Program provided through Indigenous Services Canada.

We raise funds from federal and provincial governments, philanthropic foundations, educational institutions, the private sector and individual donors to ensure a brighter, and more hopeful future for our people. In 2018-19, Indspire awarded \$16.3 million, through 5,553 scholarships and bursaries to Indigenous students. This includes \$4,453,274 in financial awards which were provided to 1494 Métis students.

While we celebrate this success, we know that the needs are great, which is why I continually advocate for additional funding for all First Nations, Inuit and Métis communities, and I am particularly encouraged that the Government of Canada has chosen to invest in post-secondary through Budget 2019.



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In addition to providing funding to students pursuing post-secondary, Indspire recognizes that our young people also need support to succeed in K-12 before considering higher education. Our annual *Soaring:* Indigenous Youth Empowerment Gatherings allow students to explore post-secondary options through campus tours, engage in career workshops and an interactive tradeshow with industry professionals, opening them to a world of possibility.

We also have several tools to help educators support Indigenous student success through mentorship and by sharing innovative practices and research. The National Gathering for Indigenous Education offers one and a half days of workshops and presentations by educators, leaders and administrators from across Canada and is an opportunity for your educators to meet their peers and learn about best practices in Indigenous education.

Through the Indspire Awards, we celebrate excellence in Indigenous achievement. Broadcast on APTN and CBC, the annual Awards honour the resilience, strength and determination of outstanding individuals while demonstrating the positive contributions of our people to Canada and the world. Our recipients serve as role models for the next generation, inspiring them to overcome difficulties and stay the course they have chosen to achieve their full potential.
